SUSPECTS SOUGHT IN SHOOTING

About 11:20 last night police responded to a report of a shooting at 114 Neff Street. They found Paul Lee laying face down in the street with several gunshot wounds. He was transported to a local hospital where he underwent emergency surgery. At last report, he is in critical, but stable condition.

Based on investigation so far, a black male subject about 5'8" tall and medium build wearing a black jacket, black toboggan and black bandana mask came from around 114 Neff and started shooting at Mr. Lee.

Officers recovered a handgun and suspected crack cocaine from Mr. Lee's clothing.

SUSPECTS SOUGHT IN BURGLARY/ROBBERY

Rodney Butler, 61, 135 Farrar Street, reports that about 12:10 a.m. this morning he answered a knock at his door. Two masked men armed with handguns entered the residence and demanded money. When Butler told them that he didn't have anything, they left the residence.

Mr. Thomas Jones told police he had arrived at the house only minutes before the robbery attempt. He escaped the residence from the back apparently to go for help. Mr. Jones noticed a black man sitting on Wells (behind the victim's residence) in a late 80's or early 90's white, two door Buick with a loud exhaust with the engine running. The car left rapidly, going south on Wells, a short time after he saw it. It is believed the vehicle may be connected.

Police are seeking two men. The first suspect is a black male about 5'7" thin build, wearing a dark colored jacket with red in it and a black hood fashioned out of some type cloth with holes cut for the eyes. The second suspect was described only as a black male about 5'10" tall. Both were said to have handguns.

FATHER AND SON CHARGED IN BURGLARY/ROBBERY

Shortly before 6:00 p.m. last night, officers responded to a report that two armed and masked men had broken into the residence at 287 Forest Pointe Dr. On duty and off-duty officers responded and caught the two armed men as they ran from the residence. They were arrested without incident.

The residents, Kelly Bowden, 38, her sister, Shelby Hassell, 32, and her boyfriend, James Cox, 28, reported that the two men entered the home in an apparent robbery attempt. Ms. Bowden was able to escape the residence and flee to a neighbor and call for help. Mr. Cox was struck and he and Ms. Hassell were tied up with cable flex ties.

Richard Tyler Hanke, 48, and his son Richard Tyler Hanke, II, 19, were arrested at the scene. They face charges of Aggravated Burglary and Aggravated Robbery. Officers recovered a shotgun and other evidence including a black leather bag containing cell phones, money, ski masks and marijuana.

The two are being held at the Madison County Jail. They will be formally arraigned on Monday, November 26th in City Court.

SUSPECTS CHARGED IN BURGLARY/ROBBERY

Jackson Police have charged three people in the October 26, 2007 incident where a Jackson man was attacked by three men who had forced their way into his home at 32 Cherry Place. Antonio Lamar Reynolds, 20 and his brother, Correy Reynolds, 18, both of Jackson, along with a 17 year old juvenile are each charged with Aggravated Burglary, Aggravated Robbery, Aggravated Kidnapping, and Auto Theft.

Mills reported to police that three men forcibly entered his home and assaulted him, bound him with extension cords and locked him in a closet. They took his wallet and car keys and left in his 1997 Honda car, which was recovered the next day.

Additionally, Antonio Reynolds and the Juvenile have been charged with the October 21, 2007 burglary and robbery of Jonathan Williams at 15 Gillman Lane. The two, who were acquaintances of the victim, stole a video game, struck Williams in the head knocking him unconscious and apparently kicked him in the ribs.

Antonio Reynolds and Correy Reynolds are being held in Madison County Jail under \$100,000 bond. Their preliminary hearing is set for November 29th at 1:30 p.m.

The Juvenile has been sent to Timber Springs for evaluation. He was on probation for a weapons violation and is also being charged with violating that probation. The District Attorney's Office has indicated they will seek to transfer him to be tried as an adult.

Investigation is ongoing regarding these individuals and additional charges are anticipated.

**ROBBERY SUSPECT SENTENCED TO 22 YEARS IN FEDERAL
PROSECUTION**

Justin Rashad Forrest, 23, 326 Lincoln St. appeared in U.S. District Court for the Western Division of Tennessee in Jackson before the Honorable U.S. District Court Judge James B. Todd for sentencing yesterday. Forrest plead guilty to being a felon in possession of a firearm and an armed career criminal. Judge Todd sentenced Forrest to serve 264 months (22 years) with 5 years of supervised probation upon release. Forrest's prosecution was a combined effort under the Project Safe Neighborhood initiative with the Jackson Office of the Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms and the United State's Attorney's Office for the Western District of Tennessee.

Forrest conviction was as a result of his arrest on January 21, 2007 after he shot Dustin Bryant, 18, Jackson and Anthony Valente, 45, Finger, in two separate robberies on the same day.

Forrest first robbed Bryant who was riding in the same vehicle with him. He shot through his seat striking Bryant who was seated behind him. Bryant suffered a grazing wound in the side.

Later, he shot Anthony Valente at North Royal Extended and Malone Road. Valente thought he was meeting Forrest to make a drug deal. Forrest robbed and shot Valente in the abdomen. Investigation at the scene revealed that Valente was in possession of a handgun as well and is also a convicted felon. He is in federal custody awaiting trial.

Forrest was arrested by Jackson Police following an extensive search in the wooded area behind Woodland Hills Subdivision. At the time of his arrest, he was wearing body armor and his pistol was recovered nearby.

Forrest still faces State charges in connection with these events. Forrest has three prior felony convictions for aggravated burglary and felony theft.

SUSPECTS CHARGED IN ROBBERY OF COLLEGE CO-ED

The Jackson Police Department has charged two men in connection with the October 17, 2007 robbery of a Lambuth University student. Greg Lynn Gillum, 21, Ave and Bryan Damone Potter, 21, both of the same address are being held in the Madison County Jail. They were arraigned in City Court this morning. Bond was set at \$20,000 each.

The robbery occurred about 11:15 p.m. as the female student was attempting to get into her car in the student parking lot. Before she could get her door shut, one of the men ran up and put his hand over her mouth and nose, then took her purse.

Surveillance video shows the men exited a dark green Dodge Caravan and were prowling around the cars in the lot when the victim ran from the gym to her car in the rain.

The suspects were developed by an alert Officer on a traffic stop of a green Dodge Caravan. One subject, who was arrested as a result of the stop on unrelated narcotic investigation charges, was found by Deputies at the Madison County Jail to be in possession of a camera that belonged to the victim.
